










# Jetton Park Mountain Bike Trail Map

## SAFETY

1. Always wear a helmet.
2. Make sure all your equipment is functioning properly before you start.
3. Carry a cell phone for use in emergency.
4. Ride with a partner when possible.
5. Familiarize yourself with trail so you will know where you are on trail at all times.
6. Maintain control of your bicycle.
7. Ride on open trails only.
8. If you come upon a hazardous condition on the trail, when possible, place a marker before hazard to alert oncoming riders.
